

Re-Opening Guidelines for Nyungwe National Park

17th June, 2020

We are excited to welcome you back to the Nyungwe National Park, where we ensure a safe environment for all staff and guests. Please be aware of the new measures in place to protect our visitors, staff and wildlife from the spread of COVID-19:

- All domestic tourists visiting Nyungwe National Park are expected to test negative 48 (forty-eight) hours prior to visiting the park. The results should be presented at Uwinka or Gisakura visitor center.
- 2. All International tourists are expected to test negative for COVID-19 within 72 hours prior to their arrival in Rwanda; and will take a second Covid-19 test upon arrival at Kigali International Airport, prior to visiting any tourist attraction. Tests results should be presented at Uwinka or Gisakura visitor center prior to visiting the park.
- 3. All guests and staff are expected to ensure the correct use of masks at all times. We recommend the use of surgical face masks while visiting the park.
- 4. All guests and staff are expected to wash their hands at handwashing stations set up at all entry points.
- All guests and staff are expected to clean and disinfect their footwear before and after visiting the park.
- 6. All guests are expected to adhere to social distancing measures at least I-2 meters. Signage and floor markings will help direct and inform the guests within public spaces.
- All guests are expected to adhere to social distancing measures including an unoccupied seat between each passenger in all tourist vehicles as directed by Rwanda Utilities Regulatory Authority (RURA).
- 8. Tourists are required to carry hand sanitizers whilst visiting the park.
- All staff and guests will have their temperature measured at the entrance of the park. In case of high temperature (above 37.6 °C), health authorities will be informed via the tollfree number 114 and entrance to the park will not be permitted.
- 10. All staff operating in Nyungwe National park are tested every two weeks.
- 11. Electronic payment through Irembo remains the only accepted mode of payment using debit / credit card or Mobile Money.



- 12. Tourists are required to fill out and sign guest registration and indemnity forms, downloadable at: https://www.visitrwanda.com/rwanda-reopens/, and submit the forms electronically to the park: thierry.hitimana@rdb.rw
- 13. All persons are expected to maintain a distance of at least 10 (ten) meters at all times while visiting primates in Nyungwe National Park.
- 14. For chimpanzees, a group of 8 (eight) tourists will be permitted for a maximum of 1 (one) hour for every visitation.
- 15. These guidelines will be implemented alongside other existing rules in Nyungwe National Park.
